




### ABOUT

The Irish Concrete Society is a not for profit learned society founded in 1973 to support and encourage technical excellence in the design and construction of concrete. It is a cross-sectorial, independent, impartial, science and engineering based organisation. We are funded through membership subscriptions and the events that we run.

Membership is open to all who have an interest in concrete with our corporate membership spread representing almost every sector in the concrete construction industry.



We run or co-host over twenty events annually catering for over 1000 participants. Our prestigious Annual Awards, now over 37 years running, recognise technical excellence in design and construction in concrete.

The Society is managed by a full time Executive Officer, governed by a crosssectoral representative Council and operated by a board of Directors. We are not a trade association and we do not promote or market concrete. Our focus is purely on technical matters relating to concrete technology and construction.



### **TECHNICAL EVENTS AND FORMAL EDUCATION**


Irish Concrete Society technical seminars are designed to deal with real industry challenges and demands. All content is delivered by experienced professionals from within the construction industry. Previous topics covered in recent seminars include 'Designing with Modern Concretes' and 'Masonry and Rendering'.



With the increasing importance of demonstrating a commitment to qualifications, our education programme includes offerings for both professionals and operatives. Our Fundamentals of Concrete Technology course offers a route to achieve a professional qualification in concrete technology and construction. The Concrete Ticket offers those who physically work with concrete a structured course covering good site practice. The formal recognition of skill is obtained by passing the Concrete Ticket test and receiving the photo ID card.



Our site visits take us to various parts of Ireland to view interesting and significant projects being constructed. Our annual meeting with the Northern Ireland Branch of the UK Concrete Society includes a site visit and a social function.





### **TECHNICAL RESOURCES**


The Society aims to provide members with the best available technical advice and guidance. Access is provided to leading technical information on concrete technology and construction through our website. This includes access to the concrete vault search facility, advice sheets, concrete repair guidance notes and the concrete practice sheets.
